





### 1. Schofield Hall

This historic structure, built in 1916, is the original campus building. Though you'll never have a class here, the offices of Admissions, Financial Aid, Multicultural Affairs, International Education and Academic Advising/Career Services are all found in this building.



### 2. Davies Center

Behind Schofield Hall, connected by a sheltered walkway, is our student union, Davies Center. Davies houses the University Bookstore and numerous other service areas, including most of the dining options for lower campus.

**The new W.R. Davies Student Center will open in fall 2012 — check it out on the back!**



### 3. Nursing Building

Tucked away at the edge of the 200-acre Putnam Park nature area is the Nursing Building, which houses all the facilities for the undergraduate and graduate nursing programs, as well as the environmental public health program.



### 4. L.E. Phillips Science Hall

Across the parking lot from the Nursing Building is L.E. Phillips Science Hall, home to the natural and computer science programs. Phillips Hall houses classrooms, labs and greenhouses. This building also has the area's only planetarium and the James Newman Clark Bird Museum.



### 5. Schneider Social Science Hall

North of Phillips Hall you will find Schneider Hall, the home of the College of Business and the departments of economics, political science and sociology. The Parking and Transportation Services office and Honors Program also are located in Schneider.

**FUN FACT:** UW-Eau Claire students can ride the city bus system for free.



### 6. Central Campus Mall

Continue on past Schneider and you will see one of the most popular spots on campus, the Central Campus Mall. During the warmer months you'll find students hanging out by the clock tower, enjoying a snack, listening to live music, playing Frisbee or taking a quick nap.

**FUN FACT:** UW-Eau Claire has 250+ student organizations that you can explore at BOB (the Blugold Organizations Bash).



### 7. Zorn Arena

Next you'll find Zorn Arena, which accommodates up to 3,500 people and is used for basketball games, The Forum and Artists Series, major concerts, campus entertainment and commencement.



### 8. Brewer Hall/Kjer Theatre

Connected to Zorn Arena to the east is Brewer Hall. Many College of Education and Human Sciences classes are located here, as well as the Children's Center and Kjer Theatre (one of four theaters on campus).

**Construction of a new Education Building is slated to start in April 2012 — check it out on the back!**



### 9. Hibbard Humanities Hall

Across the street from Zorn Arena is Hibbard Hall, where you'll find the English, foreign languages, history, communication and journalism, psychology, mathematics, and philosophy and religious studies departments. Our award-winning student newspaper, The Spectator, also is produced here.



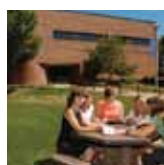
### 10. Footbridge

Moving past the Ecumenical Religious Center on your right, you'll come to the Chippewa River footbridge. Stop midway across the bridge for a panoramic view of campus. Look left and you'll spot "The Hill" to upper campus, where nine of our 11 residence halls are located.



### 11. Haas Fine Arts Center

Continue across the footbridge and you'll find yourself in front of the Haas Fine Arts Center. You'll spend much of your time here if you're a music, theater or visual arts major. Facilities worth a peek include the Foster Art Gallery and various concert halls.



### 12. Human Sciences and Services

Take a look across the Haas parking lot and you'll see the Human Sciences and Services building, which faces Water Street. This academic building houses the special education, social work, and communication sciences and disorders departments as well as the Center for Service-Learning.



### 13. McIntyre Library

Back across the footbridge and to the right of Schofield Hall you'll find McIntyre Library — five stories of resources, including numerous study stations and computer labs.

**FUN FACT:** You can check out laptops and video cameras for free from the library!



### 14. Old Library

From McIntyre Library's main lobby you'll see a hallway leading to the Old Library, which houses the campus's largest computer lab and the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning. Upstairs you'll find the Academic Skills Center and Counseling Services. Also look for a scale model of campus in the first-floor breezeway connecting Schofield Hall and the Old Library.



### 15. Hilltop Center

Return to the main lobby of the McIntyre Library and head outside to Garfield Avenue. Turn left and you'll find yourself walking up "The Hill," but not before passing the two lower-campus residence halls, Thomas and Putnam. On your way up the hill you'll pass directly beneath Hilltop Center, where you'll find upper-campus dining facilities, the Bowling and Billiard Center and the Environmental Adventure Center.



### 16. Towers Hall/Housing and Residence Life Office

After you've passed under Hilltop Center, Towers North and Towers South residence halls will be to your right. Towers North also is the location of the Housing and Residence Life office. All residence halls include 24-hour computer labs, FREE wireless Internet, study lounges, kitchens, laundry facilities and TV lounges.



### 17. McPhee Center/Olson Addition

Follow University Drive to the left and then to the right, and you'll come to the McPhee Center/Olson Addition, the only building on upper campus where academic classes are held. The kinesiology and athletic training programs are located here, along with gymnasiums, an indoor swimming pool, the Strength and Performance Center, racquetball and tennis courts, indoor track, climbing wall, dance studio, gymnastics area and wrestling room.



### 18. Crest Wellness Center

Follow University Drive back in the opposite direction, taking a right after passing Towers Hall. Continue heading north as far as you can go, and between Sutherland and Governors residence halls you'll find Crest Wellness Center, which includes Higherground (a food/snack area and dance club), the Fitness Center, Student Health Service and the University Police.
