This is an evening for families, communities, educators and others affected by children's mental health to talk with one another about child and adolescent mental health issues, hear from a variety of professionals that touch the lives of children with mental health needs, and discover how everyone can better work together.

The film, **ARE THE KIDS ALRIGHT?\*** is a searing documentary examining the crisis in mental health care for children and adolescents at risk. With unprecedented access to families, the courts, and psychiatric and correctional institutions, the filmmakers followed several families to document the tragic results of a catastrophic decline in the availability of appropriate mental health services for young people. From every day family and developmental stresses to severe, clinical mental illness, these families are struggling to get the supports they need, but there is very little help available to them.

A PANEL DISCUSSION ON CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH IN THE CHIPPEWA VALLEY WILL FOLLOW THE FILM.

A Day of Film & Reflection: Conference for Professionals will utilize film as a catalyst to discuss issues that affect children and adolescents with mental health needs and their families. Films and film clips will be shown that encourage dialogue and discussion on how the issues raised relate to children's mental health in the Chippewa Valley.

**AM I BROKEN?** is a feature-length documentary currently in production on location at the Children's Institute for Learning Differences (CHILD). Cameras follow three teachers for one full school year as they work to solve the intricate mystery of destructive behavioral patterns.

**CRY FOR HELP** Two years after the country was rattled by the Virginia Tech shooting that left 33 dead, the producers take a critical look at the issues surrounding teen depression and suicide in Cry for Help.

**EDUCATION REVOLUTION** This film will feature the voices of students, family members, peers and educators, and will examine key questions such as: What types of supports and interventions, including PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports), enable children with emotional/behavioral challenges to succeed? What role does school-wide culture play? How are behavioral problems linked to communication and learning disabilities?

**CHRISTINE DUNNING, PH.D.** is a former Board Member and Vice-President of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies. Dr. Dunning has served as a consultant for such events as the Chicago American Flight 191 and Pan Am Lockerbie air crashes, Desert Shield/Storm, The Pentagon 9/11 terrorist incident, the Intefedah in Israel and various community, school violence, disaster incidents and accidents. She is a Professor of Governmental Affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in the School of Continuing Education. She received her M.S. and her Ph.D. in Social Sciences Multi-Disciplinary in 1975 and attended Marquette Law School. Dr. Dunning is a member of the American Psychological Association, and the Association of Traumatic Stress Specialists. She has taught Trauma Counseling since 1991 for both graduate and professional audiences.
