

Summer Housing 2017

Welcome to the information guide for Summer 2017 Housing.

Please make sure to read this ENTIRE document thoroughly as there are many scenarios for the summer so you need to find the one that fits your situation

1. Who can stay on campus for Summer?

If you have an on-campus job, off-campus job, taking summer classes, internship, or student teaching you can stay on campus for summer.

This includes incoming transfers/freshman who will be taking classes beginning in Summer 2017. (see Scenario #4)

2. Who needs to complete a Summer application?

Anyone who currently lives on campus and needs to stay past May 20th at 6:00pm or anyone that currently lives off campus and wants to stay on-campus for summer.

Note: If you are GRADUATING and you need to stay past 6:00pm on May 20th, make sure you complete the summer application.

3. How to apply to live on campus for Summer:

A. Current UWEC student or Incoming Transfer/Freshman student

- i. Go to My Housing Portal (uwec.edu/housing)
- ii. Click My Application
- iii. Click Summer to complete application

B. Student from another university:

- i. Contact the Housing Office at 715-836-3674

4. What are the buildings and the rates for Summer 2017?

Towers North Double: \$13/night

Towers North Single: \$16/night

Chancellors: \$20/night (see #5 below)

Haymarket: ([More info](#))

- Studio (1 available)- \$27/night
- 1 bedroom double (2 available)-\$27/night
- 2 bedroom double (8 available)-\$21/night
- 4 bedroom single (8 available)-\$27/night

(Note: no Katherine Thomas this summer due to the Garfield Avenue construction project)

5. Who can live in Chancellors Hall for Summer 2017?

Only individuals who have a Spring 2017 assignment or a Fall 2017 assignment in Chancellors may stay in Chancellors for summer.

For Summer 2017, we will have designated summer apartments that individuals will need to move to. These rooms most likely will not be your spring or fall room assignment but we strive to keep you on the same floor to limit the length of the move.

Space in Chancellors will be limited for the summer term. All assignments will be based off summer application received date.

6. How do I get my Summer room assignment?

You will receive an email designating what building you have been assigned as well as check in details in May. You will receive your actual room number at check-in.

7. What if my dates of stay change?

Contact Peggy Erickson at 715-836-3674 or erickspj@uwec.edu. You will only see a refund if the value is over \$40 with the changed dates of stay. If you need to stay longer, additional days will be added

8. What if I need to cancel my summer housing?

You can cancel up to the date you specify as your move-in date.

BELOW HIGHLIGHTS THE DIFFERENT SCENARIOS, FIND THE ONE THAT DEFINES YOUR SITUATION:

SCENARIO 1: I currently live on campus and I will live on campus next Fall 2017:

1. What dates can I stay for summer?

- A. You can stay anytime May 20th-September 1st (September 2nd starts Fall Semester)
- B. On the application you will select the dates of your stay for the dates you need. It could be 5 days, 2 weeks, or the entire summer. Any time within these dates you can specify what works for you.

2. When do I need to move to my summer assignment?

- A. If you are staying on campus for summer immediately after spring term ends: You need to move to your summer room Sunday, May 21st by 4:00pm.
- B. If you are staying on campus other dates throughout the summer: You need to move to your summer room on the date you specified as your move-in date. (You will not be able to leave your belongings on campus).

3. When do I move to my fall assignment?

- A. If you are staying for summer until September 1st, you will move to your fall room assignment on Saturday, August 26th by Noon.

SCENARIO 2: I currently live on campus spring 2017 but I will not live on campus for Fall 2017:

1. What dates can I stay for summer?

- A. You may stay from May 20th -August 26th at Noon.
- B. On the application you will select the dates of your stay for the dates you need. It could be 5 days, 2 weeks, or the entire summer. Any time within these dates you can specify what works for you.

2. When do I need to move to my summer assignment?

- A. If you are staying on campus for summer immediately after spring term ends: You need to move to your summer room by Sunday, May 21stat 4:00pm.
- B. If you are staying on campus other dates throughout the summer: You need to move to your summer room on the date you specified as your move-in date. (You will not be able to leave you belongings on campus).

3. When do I need to move-out?

A. You will need to move-out on Saturday, August 26th by Noon

SCENARIO 3: I do not currently live on campus for Spring 2017 and will not live on campus Fall 2017:

1. What dates can I stay?

A. You may stay May 21st beginning at Noon-August 26th at Noon

B. On the application you will select the dates of your stay for the dates you need. It could be 5 days, 2 weeks, or the entire summer. Any time within these dates you can specify what works for you.

2. When do I need to move to my summer assignment?

A. If you specify your move in date as May 21st, you need to move into your summer room Sunday, May 21st starting at Noon

B. Otherwise, you will move-in on the date that you choose

3. When do I need to move out?

You will need to move-out on Saturday, August 26th by Noon

SCENARIO 4: I do not currently live on campus for Spring 2017 but I will live on campus Fall 2017: (incoming freshman/transfers qualify here).

1. What dates can I stay?

A. You may stay May 21st-September 1st (fall semester begins September 2nd)

B. On the application you will select the dates of your stay for the dates you need. It could be 5 days, 2 weeks, or the entire summer. Any time within these dates you can specify what works for you.

2. When do I need to move to my summer assignment?

A. If you specify your move in date as May 21st, you need to move into your summer room Sunday, May 21st starting at Noon

B. Otherwise, you will move-in on the date that you choose

C. Watch your email in May for check-in procedure details

3. When do I move to my Fall Assignment?

A. If you are staying for summer until September 1st, you will move to your Fall room assignment on Saturday, August 26th by Noon.

SCENARIO 5: I only need end of spring term until June 1st.

1. If you currently live in Towers North, Towers South, Chancellors, or Haymarket for Spring 2017:

A. Your assignment will be your current Spring 2017 room

2. If you live in Bridgman, Governors, Horan, Murray, Sutherland, Oak Ridge, Putnam, Thomas, Priory for Spring 2017:

A. You will preference either Towers North or Haymarket as your temporary assignment on your application and you will need to move to your summer assignment by Sunday, May 21st at 4:00pm.

B. Watch your email for building assignment details in early May and further check-in instructions.

3. If you currently do not live on campus but need to stay anytime from May 21st-June 1st:

A. You can preference an assignment to be in either Towers North or Haymarket. You will need to check in Sunday, May 21st starting at Noon.

B. Watch your email for building assignment details in May and further check-in instructions

SCENARIO 6: I plan to stay on campus for a short time in the beginning of the summer for example May 20th-June 1st. Then I will leave campus from June 1st-July 20th. I will returned to live on campus July 20th-Septmeber 1st.

- A. On your application, put in the NOTES section that dates of stay you need. The date section will only allow you to put one stay so add additional information for the housing staff.
- B. In this scenario, you will be given an assignment for the May 20th to June 1st time frame. Then you will need to move all items out of your assigned room. You will be assigned a space for July 20th-September 1st which most likely will not be the same assignment you had for the beginning of the summer term. Additionally, no storage for your personal items is available.

SCENARIO 7: I am a student teacher and currently live on-campus. I will need to stay past the May 20th close date until my school obligations end.

1. What dates can I stay?

A. May 20th until your school obligations end

B. On the application you will select the dates you need to stay.

2. If you live in Towers North, Towers South, Haymarket for Spring 2017:

A. Your assignment will be your current Spring 2017 room

3. If you live in Bridgman, Chancellors, Governors, Horan, Murray, Sutherland, Oak Ridge, Putnam, Priory, Thomas:

- A. You will receive a temporary assignment that you will need to move to by Sunday, May 21st at 4:00pm based on your preference of either Towers North or Haymarket.
- B. Watch your email in May for assignment information and check-in procedure details

SCENARIO 8: I am a student teacher and currently live off campus but need to stay on campus until my teaching obligations are done.

1. What dates can I stay?

- A. Sunday, May 21st starting at Noon until your school obligations are done
- B. On the application you will select the dates of your stay for the dates you need.

2. How do I get my summer assignment?

- B. Watch your email in May for assignment information and check-in procedure details. You will be able to preference Towers North or Haymarket as your hall choices.

SCENARIO 9: If I am a Housing Summer Employee:

1. When do I move to my Summer room assignment in Towers North?

- A. By Sunday May 21st at 4:00pm
- B. Watch your email in May for check-in procedure details
- C. No cost to stay in Towers North for the summer as long as you work 20 hours per week on a crew or 16 hours per week at any front desk.

2. If you live in Chancellors for Spring 2017 or will live there in Fall 2017:

- A. You are eligible to live in Chancellors for Summer 2017 for the additional cost of \$416
- B. Spaces will be limited in Chancellors for summer 2017. Summer students will be assigned first and then if spaces remain, student workers will be assigned.

3. If you want to live at Haymarket for the summer:

- A. You will need to pay the difference between the Towers room rate and the Haymarket room rate.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

No hot water in TOWERS HALL May 20-May 30, what do I do?

There will be no hot water in Towers North or South, May 20th at 6pm until May 30th at 3pm. Students staying in Towers will have access to Murray Hall to access hot water for showers.

Bikes:

If you will have your bike here for the summer, you will need to get a bike permit.

- 2017 Summer Bicycle Permits are available in the Housing Office, Towers 112, between the hours of 7:45 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday starting May 1st or after.
- Permits will also be available at all residence hall front desks.
- Although Bicycle Permits are not required by the Parking Office, we provide summer identification permits to help Public Safety identify abandoned bikes during the summer.
- Any bike that does not have a permit may be considered abandoned and therefore confiscated.
- These permits are free.

Summer Guest Policy:

No guest may stay for more than 2 consecutive nights within a 7 day period in the residence halls/apartments.

Items in your summer room assignment:

- You are responsible for all items in your summer room (if they are yours or your friends), all items need to be moved out by your designated move-out date or you will be charged.
- There is no storage of any items in rooms over the summer
- Housing is not responsible for any lost or damaged items that are not removed properly

Campus Parking:

May 23-September 5th: Parking Permits are not required in any of the “R” stalls on campus which are located in the following lots ONLY: Bridgman, Chancellors, Governors, Oak Ridge, or Towers Lots.

Haymarket Parking:

Onsite underground parking will be available for \$40 per month. More information about parking to come in your summer assignment email in May.
