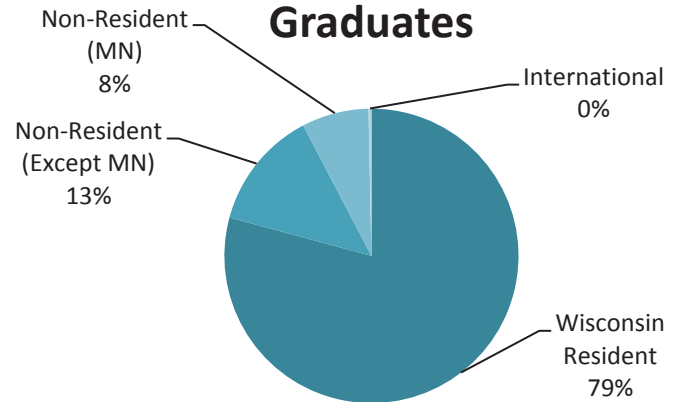

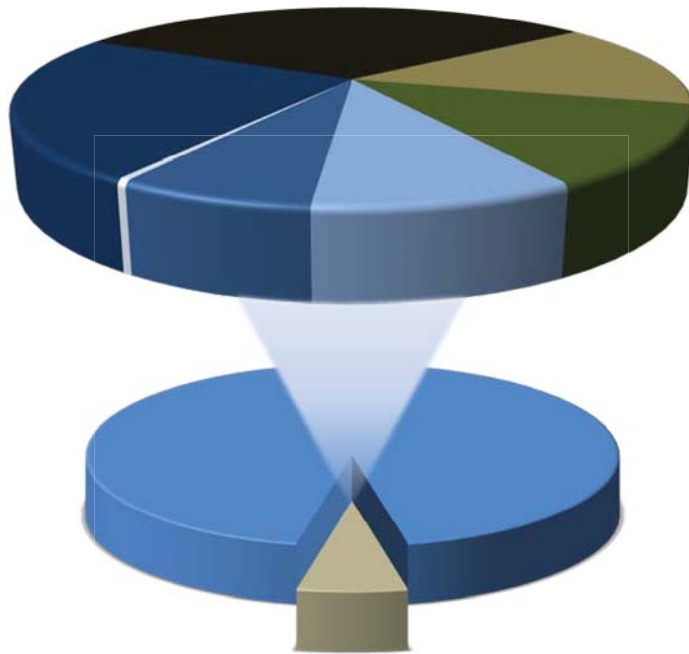

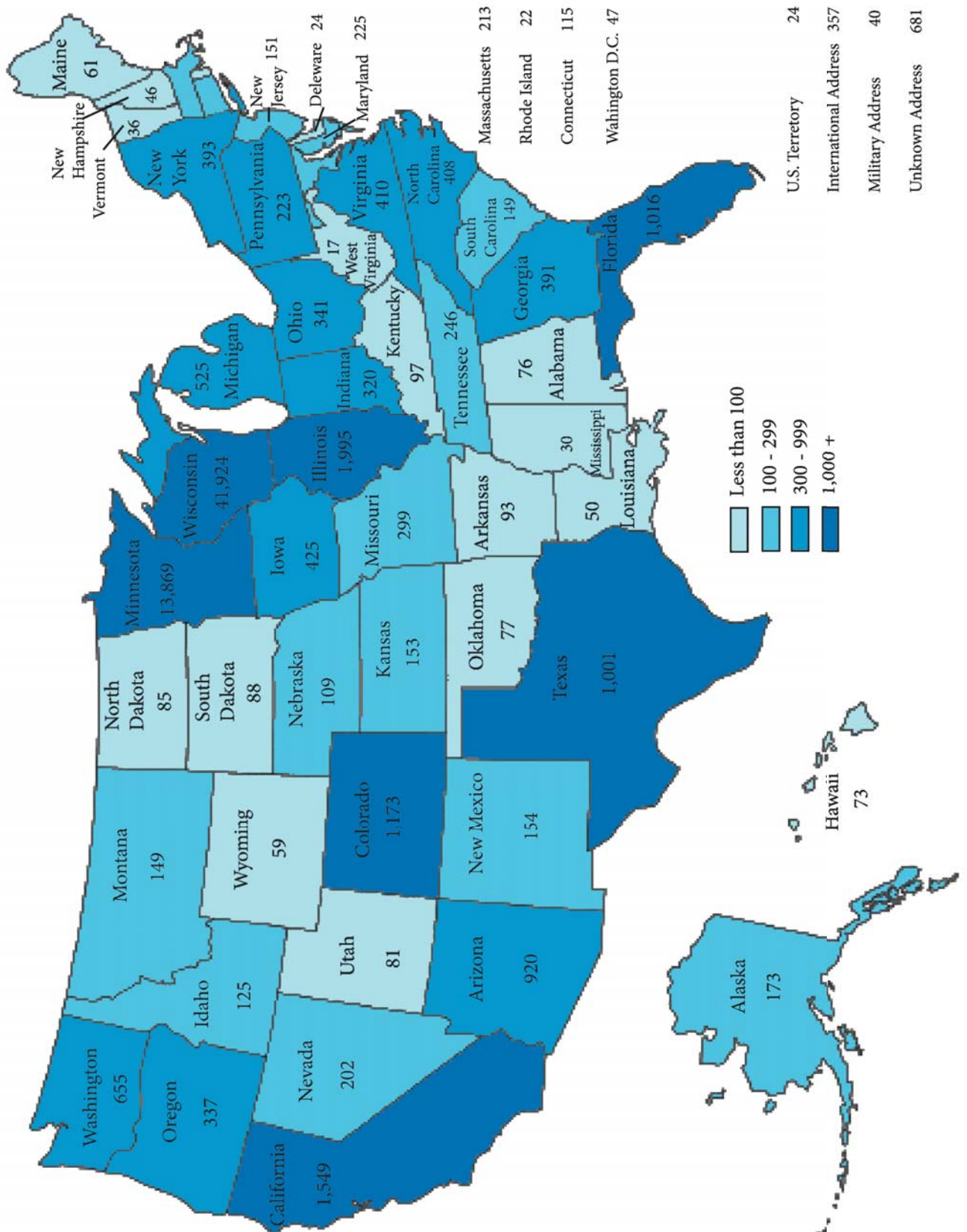

Definitions

Cohort	A group of students who reach a milestone event together at the same time. For example, a group of students who matriculate at the same time is an “entering cohort.” On the other hand, a group of students who receive their degrees on the same date comprise a “graduating cohort.”
Degree-Seeking	Students enrolled in courses for credit and recognized by the institution as seeking a degree, certificate, or other formal award. High school students also enrolled in postsecondary courses for credit are not considered degree/certificate-seeking.

First-Time Student	A student who has no prior postsecondary experience (except as noted below) attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. This includes students enrolled in academic or occupational programs. It also includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term, and students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).
Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Graduate	Full-time Equivalent (FTE) is a metric which counts the number of part-time and full-time individuals together, but each individual is counted as a specific fraction of a full-time individual. For example, FTE enrollments count each student the fraction equal to their credit load divided by a standard load of 12 student credit hours.

Full-Time Student (Graduate)	A student enrolled for 9 or more semester credits.
Full-Time Student (Undergraduate)	A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits.
General Purpose Revenue (GPR)	Revenue received from the state of Wisconsin (state taxpayer dollars).
Special Student	Students who are enrolled in courses but are not enrolled in a degree program.
Student Credit Hour (SCH)	A credit hour is a unit of measurement representing an hour (50 minutes) of instruction over a 15-week period in a semester. It is applied toward the total number of hours needed for completing the requirements of a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal award.

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
