Crebbin, Ed., June. **Horse Tales.** (IMC CBC Fic H787 2005)

This collection of fourteen horse tales draws on a wide range of places, times, and cultures: There are tales from ancient Greece, fourteenth-century Mongolia, France in the Middle Ages, and more.

Draper, Judith. **My First Horse and Pony Care Book.** (IMC CBC 636.1 D7914 2006)

This introduction to horse and pony care features information about breeds, what horses and ponies eat, mucking, handling a horse, cleaning, clipping, bathing, and riding safely.

Gaff, Jackie. **I Wonder Why Horses Wear Shoes And Other Questions About Horses.**  
(IMC CBC 636.1 G1203h 2002)

This new addition to the I Wonder Why series reins in a herd of questions children like to ask about one of their favorite animals.

Haas, Jessie. **Hoofprints: Horse Poems.** (IMC CBC 811. 54 H1116h 2006)

This collection of more than 100 poems celebrates horses from ancient times to the present.

Hendry, Linda. **Horse Crafts.** (IMC CBC 745.5 H3850h 2006)

This book contains fifteen fun filled projects all about horses.

Korda, Margaret. **Horse Housekeeping: Everything You Need To Know To Keep A Horse At Home.**  
(IMC CBC 636.1 k8414h 2005)

This anecdotal reference guide explains how to house horses in the backyard. Sharing twenty-five years of experience with keeping horses at home, the authors stress the satisfaction, the triumphs, and the pitfalls of the practice.

Ransford, Sandy. **The Kingfisher Illustrated Horse And Pony Encyclopedia.** (IMC CBC 636.1 K5905 2004)

This encyclopedia is packed full of beautiful photographs of horses and ponies, showing how they look, what they do, and where in the world they are found. It explains care of horses and ponies, riding lessons, and breeds.

Roberts, Monty. **The Horses in My Life.** (IMC CBC 636.1 R5433h 2005)

Monty Roberts, a true horse whisperer, celebrates his favorite horses from the thousands he has worked with over the years. He highlights 52 horses from a Thoroughbred to a ranch horse in this title that is also autobiographical.

Sauer, Tammi. **Cowboy Camp.** (IMC CBC E Sa 855c 2005)

Although Avery cannot eat the right grub, is allergic to horses, and gets rope burns from lassos, he learns at camp that he is uniquely qualified in a most important cowboy quality. Wildly humorous pictures add to the story.

Williams, Susan. **Wind Rider.** (IMC CBC Fic W6756w 2006)

Fern, a teenager living in 4000 B.C., defies the expectations of her people by displaying a unique and new ability to tame horses and by also questioning many of the traditional activities of women.

Yerxa, Leo. **Ancient Thunder.** (IMC CBC 758.3 Y476a 2006)

The love of wild horses, their mythic qualities, and their significance for the native people of the Great Plains resonates in this unusual and gorgeously illustrated work.
