- Anholt, Catherine. **Sun, Snow, Stars, Sky.** (CBC E An496s 1995)
This book tells what people do in different seasons and in different kinds of weather.
- Brown, Margaret Wise. **The Little Island.** (CBC E B8143li 1993)
Depicts the changes that occur on a small island as the seasons come and go, as day changes to night, and as a storm approaches.
- Cash, Megan Montague. **What Makes the Seasons?** (CBC 574.543 C2687w 2003)
Easy rhyming text describes how plants grow and respond to seasonal changes.
- Dupasquier, Philippe. **Our House on the Hill.** (CBC E D9256o 1987)
Pictures without text depict the month-by-month activities of a family in their country house on a hill.
- Fuchs, Diane Marcial. **A Bear for All Seasons.** (CBC E F9513b 1995)
Fox comes to visit Bear on a cold winter day, and they reminisce about the seasons of the year and what they like best about each one.
- Geisert, Bonnie. **River Town.** (CBC 307.72 G2777r 1999)
Describes, in brief text and illustrations, a year in the life of a river bank town and the many changes that occur throughout the seasons.
- George, Jean Craighead. **Dear Rebecca, Winter is Here.** (CBC E C2935d 1993)
A grandmother explains to her granddaughter how the arrival of winter brings changes in nature and the earth's creatures, and how the return of spring and summer will bring more changes.
- Gibbons, Gail. **The Seasons of Arnold's Apple Tree.** (CBC E G3527s 1984)
As the seasons pass, Arnold enjoys a variety of activities as a result of his apple tree. Includes a recipe for apple pie and a description of how an apple cider press works.
- Johnson, Sylvia A. **How Leaves Change.** (CBC 581.1 J6375h 1986)
Describes the structure and purpose of leaves, the ways in which they change as part of the natural cycle of the seasons, and the process that creates their autumn colors.
- Johnston, Tony. **Yonder.** (CBC E J6485y 1988)
As the plum tree changes in the passing seasons so do the lives of a three-generation farm family.
- Kroll, Virginia L. **The Seasons and Someone.** (CBC E K9197s 1994)
A young Eskimo girl witnesses the changing seasons in Alaska.
- Morrison, Gordon. **Oak Tree.** 9CBC 583.46 M8348o 2000)
Describes the impact of the changing seasons on an old oak tree and the life that surrounds it.
- Provensen, Alice. **The Year at Maple Hill Farm.** (CBC E P9487y)
Describes the seasonal changes on a farm and surrounding countryside throughout the year.
- Risom, Ole. **I Am A Bunny.** (CBC E R4956b 1963)
Nicholas the bunny describes his activities during different seasons.

- Ryan, Susan Jane. **Esmeralda and the Enchanted Pond.** (CBC E R9583e 2001)
Esmeralda learns some simple science lessons as well as lessons in using her imagination when she and her dad visit a pond during all four seasons and see a variety of forest creatures.
- Sipiera, Paul P. **The Seasons.** (CBC 525.5 Si755s 1998)
Explains how and why the four seasons occur and examines the weather they bring.
- Stein, David Ezra. **Leaves.** (CBC E St3421 2007)
A curious bear observes how leaves change throughout the seasons.
- Stewart, David. **Seasons.** (CBC 525.5 St493s 2002)
An introduction to the causes and effects of the different seasons of the year.
- Stewart, Sarah. **The Money Tree.** (CBC E St495m 1991)
In summer the leaves on the strange tree growing in Miss McGillicuddy's yard are harvested by many people, but when Miss McGillicuddy thinks about needing firewood for the winter, she realizes the tree may have another use.
- Stringer, Lauren. **Winter is the Warmest Season.** (CBC E St867w 2006)
A child describes pleasant ways to stay warm during the winter, from sipping hot chocolate and eating grilled cheese sandwiches to wearing woolly sweaters and sitting near a glowing fireplace.
- Weiss, Nicki. **On a Hot, Hot Day.** (CBC E W4365o 1992)
Mother and young son affectionately enjoy activities together during each season of the year.
- Zagwyn, Deborah Turney. **Turtle Spring.** (CBC E Z135t 1998)
The changing seasons bring surprises to Clee, including a new baby brother early in the year and a turtle whose life seems to crawl away in the winter.
- Zolotow, Charlotte. **The Song.** (CBC E Z755so 1982)
Throughout the year, Susan hears a little bird inside her singing of the changing seasons, but no one else can hear it.
