

Distance Education Courses

"Distance education" refers to any course in which the instructor is at a physical distance from the students over half the time. The course may be delivered via computer (online), audio-conferencing, two-way video, or other means. Online course registration must be completed three weeks before the start of the course. See course listing for exact date. All students enrolled in an online course must abide by the drop, withdraw deadlines for the term whether or not they have logged on to the course.
