

Registering to Vote

Do you know if you're registered to vote? If not, go to <https://vpa.wi.gov/VoterSearchScreen.aspx?Language=en-us> in order to find out if and where you are registered to vote.

If you aren't registered to vote you're or if you would like to change where you are registered to vote here is what you need to know:

- If you are a Wisconsin resident who has a valid Wisconsin Drivers license you need to bring it with you to register to vote.
- If you do not have a valid Wisconsin drivers license, then you need to use the last four digits of your social security number or have a Wisconsin state ID.
- If you have registered to vote at a different address, then know that previous address.
- Know your current address.

There are three ways to register:

1. You can register by mail. Download the registration form at <http://gab.wi.gov/forms/gab-131-english-fillable>, complete the form and mail it into the appropriate municipal clerk's office. You can find your municipal clerk at <http://gab.wi.gov/clerks/directory>.
2. You can register through the early registration process with a certified deputy up to 21 days prior to the election. You can register t at your municipal clerk's office during business hours up until the Friday before the election.
3. You can register at your polling place on election day. You must bring proof or residency.

Proof of Residency:

Proof of residency needs to establish a voter's current address. Proof of residence is required to register before you can vote. **If you want to avoid having to provide proof of residency then register at your municipal clerk's office or through a special registration deputy 28 days or longer before the next election.**

The following options constitute acceptable options to prove residency:

1. A current and valid Wisconsin driver license.
2. A current and valid Wisconsin identification card.
3. Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
4. Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
5. A university, college or technical institute identification card (must include photo), ONLY if the bearer provides a fee receipt (tuition receipt) dated within the last nine months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk.
6. A gas, electric or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before election day.

You can receive a special photo ID that will allow you to vote in Davies Center room 156. You can print your tuition bill from My CampS. This will serve as your document to prove enrollment at UW- Eau Claire.
