EDINBURGH (LEITH), SCOTLAND

If ever there were a town made for walking, it would be Scotland's capital. Renowned as one of Europe's most attractive cities, Edinburgh's Old Town and New Town are a marvelous mixture of elegant streets, charming squares and quaint alleyways. The city's most distinctive landmark is Edinburgh Castle, set high up on a craggy cliff in the center of the city.

INVERGORDON, SCOTLAND

Invergordon is the port for Inverness, the capital of the Highlands. The northern part of Scotland, known as the Highlands, is one of the most scenic places in Europe. Among the main attractions is a landscape of mountains and forested hills. Visit the Inverness Castle and the Loch Ness Monster Exhibition.

LERWICK (SHETLAND ISLANDS), SCOTLAND

One hundred miles off the coast of Great Britain lies Lerwick, the main port of the Shetland Islands, in Scotland. An enchanting mix of Scotland and Norway, these islands offer a plethora of unique experiences and wildlife. Killer whales, puffins, otters, and the famous Shetland ponies can be seen everywhere. Shops are filled with woodcrafts, fiddles, fine soaps, sweaters and all things Viking.

ALESUND, NORWAY

In the spectacular fjord country on the coast between Bergen and Trondheim, Alesund, Norway covers three islands. Alesund has one of the largest and most important fishing harbors in Norway, with a fishing fleet that is one of the most modern in Europe. In 1904, practically the entire town was destroyed by a large fire. The town, originally built largely of wood, was rebuilt in stone, brick and mortar in the Art Nouveau style.

GEIRANGER (NORDFJORD), NORWAY

Geiranger is a small tourist town in the western part of Norway situated innermost in the fjord Geirangerfjord, and home to some of the most spectacular scenery in the world. Views include snow-covered mountain peaks, waterfalls, lush vegetation and the deep blue waters of the fjord. Since 2005, the Geirangerfjord has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

HELLESYLT, NORWAY

Norway's oldest Viking port, tiny Hellsylt nestles into the pastoral setting at the tip of a gorgeous fjord. Steep cliffs, mountain lakes and a glacier-fed waterfall near town add to the dramatic scenery.

BELFAST, NORTHERN IRELAND

Discover this city of ornate Victorian and Edwardian architecture, gracious gardens and friendly pubs. Thrill to the natural phenomenon of the Giants' Causeway, a stunning geological anomaly of tightly packed, uneven basalt columns disappearing into the sea.

DUBLIN, IRELAND

Cosmopolitan Dublin is the capital and largest city in Ireland. Visit historic Trinity College and gaze at the magnificently decorated Book of Kells. See Georgian mansions on Merrion Square, tour majestic St. Patrick's Cathedral and stroll through lovely St. Stephen's Green, the beautiful park immortalized by James Joyce in "Ulysses."

WATERFORD, IRELAND

Explore the medieval streets of this 1,100-year-old Viking town and admire Rodney's Tower, still in use, and see exquisite treasures in the museum. Visit the Waterford Crystal Factory or enjoy the beautiful Irish countryside as you pass majestic abbey ruins and stroll through quaint villages.

FOWEY, ENGLAND

With a rich seafaring history dating back to the 14th century, Fowey in Cornwall is still one of England's busiest ports. Stroll the esplanade and admire the view from hilltop St. Catherine's Castle.
