Admission Requirements – MEPD-PEP

- A baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college or university
- A minimum of 2.75 undergraduate gpa
- Documented commitment to teaching or an education-related profession (e.g., teaching certification, statement from a supervisor, or equivalent)
- A minimum of two years teaching experience or equivalent

 - a resume of career-related experiences
 - a statement of professional aspirations and related needs

- All application materials must be postmarked by July 1st. Applications are processed through UW-Eau Claire Admissions, the Department of Educational Studies and the Office of Graduate Studies.
