Donald L. Wolfarth held a teaching position in the Speech Department at UWEC from 1967 until his retirement in 1988. He was active as a judge in the various high school and college debate and forensics events held at UWEC. Before his UWEC teaching position, he studied with the American Institute of Parliamentarians, being first accredited as a Certified Parliamentarian and then, at the highest rank, a Certified Professional Parliamentarian. In 1969, he created the parliamentary procedure course previously offered in that department with his great expertise in this area. Professor Wolfarth's department chair said of him: "Don was outstanding as a scholar, teacher and colleague. But he was extraordinary as a friend."
