This is the recommended sequence of courses for those students with undergraduate majors other than CSD who are interested in applying for the CSD graduate program. **You must have earned at least 30 CSD credits before beginning the graduate program, however, successful completion of these courses does not assure you a spot in our graduate program.**

**FALL OFFERINGS** (ones with asterisks are also offered online summer)

- Anatomy & Physiology of the Speech Mechanism – 4 \* (CSD 256)
- Normal communication development – 3 \* (CSD 257)
- Phonetics – 2 \* (CSD 262)
- Phonological disorders – 3 (CSD 358) – P: 257 or concurrent enrollment
- Audiology – 3 (CSD 373) – 256 & 353 recommended
- Neurological aspects – 2 (CSD 440) P: 256, so could only take it if you take 256 in the summer)

**SPRING OFFERINGS**

---

- Speech and hearing science – 4 (CSD 353)
- Developmental language disorders – 4 (CSD 331) – P: 257, 258, 262.
- Aural rehabilitation – 3 (CSD 321) – 373 recommended
- Clinical procedures – 3 (CSD 370) – P: 358 or 331; dept. permission required
- Fluency disorders – 3 (CSD 352)

◆ These total more than 30 credits (34), however, if not taken before starting grad school here, they would have to be taken during the grad program, and could lengthen your 2 years plus a summer that is typical for our students.

◆ To enroll to take these credits, you would apply to the university as an undergraduate who is seeking a second undergraduate degree (**not a grad student**).
