### **Admission to Program**

Transfer students must complete CI 210 & 211 (courses will change to the ES prefix in fall 2011) in the semester prior to the one in which they wish to be considered for admission. This can be your first semester of enrollment at UW-Eau Claire.

### **Prerequisites for eligibility to register for CI 210 & 211 are:**

- (1) Pre-education status
- (2) Completion of 14 credits
- (3) Completion of ENG 102 with at least a grade of C (not C-)
- (4) Minimum resident and total GPA of 2.75 or better \*\*
- (5) Passing scores on the [PRAXIS I](#) (PPST)

**\*\* The UW-College grade point can be used to establish a resident grade point. Contact Dr. Dwight C. Watson at 715-836-2013 to discuss.**
