## 5. Requirements for Admission to the College of Business

All students who expect to earn a BSCHA degree must be admitted to the College of Business. The following criteria must be met.

A. Complete the following five courses with at least a 2.20 GPA.

- B. Present a 2.30 GPA or better in all college level courses taken prior to admission.
- C. Complete 54 credits
- D. A separate College of Business [application](#) must be filed prior to registering for 300 level Business courses.

## 6. Additional Requirements for Health Care Administration.

- a. Students must complete all courses with a grade of C- (C minus) or above and must maintain a resident and total GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- b. Only courses taken as electives outside the program may earn degree credits under the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option.

This guide is designed to help prepare students from the UW Colleges transfer to UW-Eau Claire by identifying courses that will satisfy UWEC requirements. Please consult with the [UWEC catalogue](#) for the complete list of academic requirements.
