UW-Eau Claire cannot guarantee all courses will be offered as shown, but will provide a range of courses that will enable prepared students to fulfill their requirements in a timely period. This is just a guide. Please consult your advisors, your degree audit, and the catalog to create your personalized degree plan. Note: In order to complete their degrees in four years, students should plan to take at least 15 credits each semester or at least 30 credits each year. 39 of the 120 total credits are required to be upper division credits (courses numbered 300 and higher).

Required Travel Experience

Comprehensive Art majors must complete at least one of the following travel experiences:

- 1 | UWEC-approved International Study program
- 2 | At least one of Art + Design's national field trips (e.g. New York City)
- 3 | At least two of Art + Design's regional field trips (e.g. Chicago, Minneapolis)

Senior Exhibition: To complete the Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.) program, students must participate in a Senior Exhibition hosted within the University's Foster Gallery.

NOTES**Service-Learning**

All candidates for the baccalaureate degree at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire must satisfactorily complete 30 hours of approved service-learning activity. This requirement is intended to provide students with an opportunity to serve their community, apply knowledge gained in the classroom, enhance their critical thinking skills, and become informed, active, and responsible citizens. Liberal Education Core (LE Core)

The LE Core comprises 17 learning experiences across 11 learning outcomes. Students must complete a minimum of 36 credits in courses approved for the LE Core.

- K1 – Natural Sciences; two experiences (one lab science experience is required in K1 or K2).
- K2 – Social Sciences; two experiences (one lab science experience is required in K1 or K2).
- K3 – Humanities; two experiences.
- K4 – Fine Arts; one experience.
- S1 – Written and Oral Communication; two experiences (one experience must satisfy the University writing requirement).
- S2 – Mathematics; one experience (must satisfy the University math competency requirement).
- S3 – Creativity; one experience (can be fulfilled in a student's major).
- R1 – Equity, Diversity, and Inclusivity; two experiences (one experience must meet the UW System Design for Diversity (DD) requirement).
- R2 – Global Perspectives; one experience.
- R3 – Civic and Environmental Issues; one experience.
- I1 – Integration; two experiences (one experience can be fulfilled in a student's major).
- SL—Service Learning; 30 hours

Additional LE Core Information

- Most LE Core learning experiences are course based, and many LE courses meet more than one learning outcome (e.g., K3 and R2 or K1 and R3).
- Some learning experiences can also be met outside of a traditional course (e.g., undergraduate research (S3), study abroad (I1)).
- S1 – An English placement score that fulfills the University writing requirement fulfills one S1 experience.
- S1 – A foreign Language placement score that qualifies the student to enter the 102 level satisfies one S1 experience.
- S1, R2 – A foreign language placement score that qualifies the student to enter the 202 level satisfies one experience in S1 and the R2 experience.
- S2 – A math placement score that qualifies the student to enter Math 111, 112, 113 or 114 fulfills the S2 experience.
- S3 – Completion of two credits from any approved music ensemble fulfills the S3 experience.
- I1 – Any semester long study abroad program can fulfill one I1 experience.

- b Dual-Outcome Electives - To graduate within four years in the B.F.A. program, it is recommended that some Liberal Education Core (L.E.) requirements meet at least two different outcomes with one course (approx. 3 credits). A list of Liberal Education courses and the outcomes they meet can be found on the Advising, Retention + Career Center website. It is strongly recommended that you discuss L.E. courses with your ARCC advisor.

Participation in B.F.A. Review

- ° No portfolios are required for admittance to the Art + Design Department. However, students pursuing the B.F.A. degree will be required to participate in a B.F.A. Entrance Review around their second year, where they will need to present a portfolio developed during their time at UW-Eau Claire. Students must pass this review to be accepted to continue in the B.F.A. program. To complete the review, students must apply with a minimum of 18 Art & Design credits including ART 107, ART 108, ART 110, ARTH 109 plus two courses in studio art. The maximum number of Art credits taken (incl. current enrollment) prior to the B.F.A. Entrance Review is 30.

NOTE: Transfers, Changes of Major, and other exceptions must check with the Art + Design Department and their faculty advisor to determine their position within the program and what requirements they will need to meet.
