**1.**

Briefly describe the project and the community need you intend to address. Consider these prompts to answer the question: What will you do to meet the need? What issues related to the identified need will you explore or have you already explored (i.e., learning why there is a need, how the need is being met by the organization, or using your skills to suggest better ways to meet the need).

**2.**

Learning outcomes for this project (these items should be discussed with your mentor.) Provide a brief description for all that apply:

- Develop awareness and/or deepen understanding of a specific community need or societal problem
- Explore personal role in and commitment to civic engagement
- Apply liberal education skills to solve a problem or serve a need in the community
- Other Outcomes.

**3.**

Specifically address the time frame in which your service hours will be accomplished, assuring that you will have either 15 or 30 hours at the end of your project.

4.

Describe the orientation, training and supervision you will receive for the project. Identify the person(s) responsible for these activities.

5.

In order to finish your service-learning requirement, you will need to complete a mentor-approved reflection. What format have you and your mentor agreed upon (some suggestions follow)?
