**Redefining the Here and Now:
Political Undercurrents and Submerged Perspectives**

Macarena Gómez-Barris

Extending ideas from her new book *Beyond the Pink Tide* (2018), Macarena Gómez-Barris considers art and political imaginaries from across the Americas to argue for the importance of political undercurrents and submerged perspectives.

Working from spaces across Latin/America and thinking against the normativity of nation-state formations, this talk addresses failed political desires and exhausted economic systems of dispossession. By focusing on experimental film, visual arts, geo-choreographies, and their connection to multidirectional social movements, Gómez-Barris shows what we can learn from the histories and imaginaries of the Americas as we redefine the meaning of the political in the here and now.
