Deadlines:

March 1 for fall semester & October 15 for spring semester

Admitted International Student checklist

Once students are admitted, there will be a checklist to complete prior to their arrival in Eau Claire. This can be found on the Admissions website:

Course Selection:

- For possible course schedules and offerings at UW-Eau Claire, students can browse the class schedule as a guest. See directions <https://www.uwec.edu/blugold-central/academic-planning/register-classes/class-schedules/>. Please note that these are just possible class selections. Not all courses may be available.
- Once accepted to UW-Eau Claire, students can expect an email from a UW-Eau Claire Academic Adviser who will register them for coursework.
- Students should be prepared to be flexible and work with their home university for coursework substitutions as needed.

Limited or restricted coursework:

- Unfortunately, UW – Eau Claire is unable to welcome exchange students in **graduate programs**.

- Unfortunately, exchange students studying at UW-Eau Claire are not allowed to take course work in **nursing**.
- Before completing an application for study in **accounting or finance**, please send a detailed course / module description for your Introduction to Accounting and Introduction to Finance courses to the exchange coordinator at UWEC to determine if they meet UWEC requirements for enrolling in further accounting and finance courses. There may be limited opportunities for specific coursework, due to pre-requisite material required of students studying U.S. accounting and finance methods.

Mandatory Health Insurance:

- All exchange students are required to pay for and be enrolled in the University of Wisconsin System's Student Accident & Sickness Insurance Policy. **This is a University of Wisconsin System requirement, with no exceptions.** The cost for the Accident & Sickness Insurance Policy is approximately \$1000 per semester. **The CIE will enroll the students at the beginning of the semester and the charge will be applied to their UWEC account. Students do NOT need to purchase supplemental insurance.**

DS-2019 Immigration Document:

- Upon acceptance to UW-Eau Claire, the student will receive a DS-2019, along with other helpful information in their acceptance packet.
- The DS-2019 will allow the student to apply at a U.S. embassy/consulate for their J-1 student visa. To enter the United States, the student will need their DS-2019, passport and student visa.
- Students and Exchange Coordinators should contact their local U.S. embassy/consulate to determine if there are other requirements specific to their country, including any requirements for COVID-19.

SEVIS Fee:

There is a SEVIS fee imposed by the United States Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS). The U.S. government requires this fee for all J-1 students.

- The student needs to pay this fee before their visa interview.
- The student should bring the SEVIS fee payment receipt with them to their visa interview and keep this receipt with them when entering the United States.

Buddy Program

The Buddy Program, through the Center for International Education (CIE), pairs domestic and current international students (buddies) at UW-Eau Claire with incoming international students. The goal is to build intercultural relationships with a student familiar with UWEC and U.S. culture. This program is voluntary, and new students are given the opportunity to sign up at orientation. Students will be matched with their buddy within the first two weeks of classes.

Student Organizations
