



Lower Chippewa Invasives Partnership & Friends of Putnam Park Summer Invasive Tour

July 24, 2019 from 9 – 11:30 AM

We will learn about many local, aquatic invasive species and then walk/drive along Putnam Park and UWEC campus sites to see 19 invasive plants that are in small populations that are threatening the beauty and function of this natural area.

1. Meet at the west end of Putnam Drive (At the Phillips Parking Lot on Campus) 9:00 AM to view and discuss many **Aquatic Invasive Species** with AJ Leiden – Beaver Creek Reserve AIS Coordinator
2. Walk or drive along Putnam Drive to the East, then across the Chippewa River to the Chippewa River Trail near the Haas Fine Arts Building area and then back to Phillips Parking Lot to discuss and view **Bush Honeysuckles (R), Glossy Buckthorn (R), Common Buckthorn (R), Japanese Barberry (R), Smooth Bromegrass (NR), Reed Canary Grass (NR), Garlic Mustard (R), Bishop's Goutweed (R), Canada Thistle (R), Yellow Sweet Clover (NR), Dame's Rocket (R), Burning Bush (R), Oriental Bittersweet (R), Purple Loosestrife (R), Spotted Knapweed (R), Narrow-Leaf Cattails (R), Crown Vetch (R), Small flowered touch-me-not (Not listed yet) & Black Locust (R)** (6.8 miles) by 11:00 AM
3. Discuss control methods, previous control projects, newly formed organization, future projects to engage with both organizations and more through an open panel forum. 11:30 AM or earlier
