Entering Student Senate for my first semester, I was truly ecstatic to begin making positive change through meaningful legislation at UW-Eau Claire. I believe that myself and the Academic Affairs



Commission have done just that, having put forward five pieces of strong legislation, and having three projects drafted for the second semester.

Our legislative accomplishments are as follows: Respondus Lockdown Browser, Attendance Policies During COVID, Moving Classes Online after Fall Break, Priority Registration, and (hopefully after tonight) Universal Feedback Timeframe.

We also offered guidance to students for very specific circumstances, such as assisting them in resolving issues of inconsistent communication and grading from faculty, and struggles with registration for next semester.

The goals I'd like to focus on for next semester include the following:

1. Host an engaging conversation about the allocation of the Blugold Commitment Differential Tuition, and have subsequent proposals be approved unanimously by Student Senate
2. Offer continuous support to smaller programs, and pass relevant and concise legislation in support of these programs remaining at UW-Eau Claire
3. Continue to increase the Academic Affairs Commission's membership, and increase opportunities for students interested in future senate or directorship positions to engage in leading meetings, presenting legislation, and having meaningful leadership experiences
4. Offer clarity for students as to the proper procedures for concerns with specific courses or faculty, as well as registration concerns, while still remaining within the realm of jurisdiction of the AAC
5. Host frequent and intentional open forums each month, and advertise accordingly with specific organizations and groups at UW-Eau Claire (i.e. Blugold Radio, TV-10, OMA organizations, etc.)
6. Facilitate a strong and intentional semester with the Computer Science Task Force, and ensure that student needs and concerns are amplified to relevant administration and faculty
7. Support initiatives that are directly beneficial to the student academic experience, such as direct, financial support for practicum and student teaching-based majors
8. Continue to ensure that all faculty are adequately trained with relevant technology for digital instruction, especially in conjunction with the Information Technology Commission and the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning
9. Encourage that new, commonly sought after minors and certificates be included in our offerings at UW-Eau Claire, rather than a progressive removal of programs in response to our "Health Sciences" identity shift.

This semester ITC has passed the Respondus LockDown Browser resolution, began creating a more transparent budget, and gained a lot of ground in researching the Laptop policy. We have also created the student technology survey in the first semester of the year, so we can act on its results next semester. We started the renovation of McPhee 198D, researched the possible purchase of Adobe licensing for personal devices, and began the project for setting up Mobile Credentials for Blugold Cards.

Our goals for next semester include the following:

- Deliver a much more transparent budget
  - This is already in process, but next semester is when the budget for next year needs to be finalized.
- Create a formal process for funding requests similar to SOS's
- Act on the results of the Student Technology Survey
  - One way to do this could be a resolution on ITC and senate's stance on a laptop policy based on survey results.
  - Another way would be to share the results of the survey to appropriate Faculty and Staff
- Document ITC processes more clearly
  - For example, the Student Technology Survey is created every year by ITC and does not have a formal process yet.
