





MOST COMMON ROOM TYPES



Welcome to your home away from home. Everything you need — from a computer lab to a kitchen to a washer and dryer, and everywhere you go — from class to the library to lunch, is close by. Residence halls and dining options are located on both upper and lower campus. The 10 upper-campus halls offer a spectacular view of Eau Claire and the Chippewa River, with convenient access to food, recreation and shopping. Just 234 steps down the hill, two lower-campus halls are located close to academic buildings, the library and Davies Student Center — the most popular hub at the heart of campus. And just a few minutes' walk away is your chance to live in downtown Eau Claire at Haymarket Landing, on Water Street at Aspenson Mogensen Hall, or a short drive will take you to 112 wooded acres at The Priory.

Upper-campus university housing

Bridgman Hall is home to the Kazoo Band and hosts the All Hall Fall Ball dance, the Mr. Bridgman Pageant and the Bridgman Olympics.

Chancellors Hall features apartment-style living, typically filled by sophomores and up.

Governors Hall is located next to the Crest Wellness Center and the ropes course. It hosts the "Govs Games" Olympic-style competition.

Horan Hall is located near the first hole of the disc golf course. It hosts a daylong cookout and whiffle ball tournament featuring the chancellor throwing the ceremonial first pitch.

Karlgaard Towers (Towers North and South) are newly renovated and feature air-conditioned rooms and bathrooms with more privacy and modern features. Take advantage of the nearby large athletic field for volleyball, Frisbee and soaking up the sun.

Murray Hall is located closest to the athletic and fitness facility. Like to hang around? Murray has hammocks in its lower-level study lounge.

Oak Ridge Hall is named for its beautiful bluff-side location overlooking the Chippewa River Valley and leads the campus and community trick-or-treat event.

NEW! Suite-Style Hall is scheduled to open in August 2019. It is the first suite-style hall on campus and will feature living areas that house four students each, some with single bedrooms and some with double bedrooms.

Sutherland Hall adjoins the Crest Wellness Center and features a large backyard patio with a fire pit. It hosts an annual charity silent auction.

Lower-campus university housing

Katherine Thomas Hall is better known as "KT." Here, students enjoy life among many international students and participate in a variety of cultural and global programs.

Putnam Hall is next to a campus park with scenic trails and hosts the annual "Lovestock" fundraiser.

Near-campus university housing

Aspenson Mogensen Hall is just a short walk across the footbridge to campus. Right in the heart of restaurants and coffee shops on Water Street, this apartment-style hall is home to 200+ students in single or multiple bedroom suites. It is typically filled by sophomores and up.

Haymarket Landing is in downtown Eau Claire right on the confluence of the Chippewa and Eau Claire rivers and next to the Pablo Center. It offers apartment-style living with various configurations. It is typically filled by sophomores and up.

Priory Hall is a six-minute ride from campus in a beautiful wooded location. The Priory shuttle transports students daily at regular intervals. All rooms are single capacity and typically filled by sophomores and up.
