If you would like to take a course not listed on this guide, please consult with an admissions counselor to review for transferability.

Completion of an Associate of Arts degree from any two-year MnScu institution or completion of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) waives all UW-Eau Claire liberal education requirements with the exception of any coursework specifically required by the major and the Design for Diversity requirement.

Important Notes:

- A. A maximum of 72 credits can be accepted from transfer liberal arts programs at 2-year colleges.
- B. Courses and grades both transfer to UW-Eau Claire. This means that the grades you earn prior to transferring will be factored into your cumulative GPA.
- C. Students are eligible to transfer with a GPA of 2.0; however, some majors require a higher GPA for admission. Students are encouraged to reference the [Transfer Student Admission Requirements](#) website and contact a transfer counselor to discuss major-specific admission criteria.
