Occupational and technical coursework leading to an applied associate degree may also be considered for transfer if the quality and content of the coursework from CVTC is judged to be comparable to coursework at UW-Eau Claire. Please contact the UW-Eau Claire Admissions Office for information about the current transfer policy.
