

? SUSTAINABILITY AT UWEC

- 1 Campus buildings are heated using natural gas, which burns much cleaner than coal. The plant was updated in 2021 with a new boiler, control system and fuel oil tank
- 2 The new science building is designed to be more energy efficient and is LEED Platinum Certified, helping the university achieve carbon neutrality by 2050
- 3 The library solar panels produce an average of 19,000 kWh of energy annually
- 4 > The Davies Center has been carbon neutral since it opened in 2013
 > Davies' roof-mounted panels heat water for use in the building
 > The BluBox Program launched in Davies in 2021 reduces food container waste
 > Sustainably grown produce is available to students thanks to hydroponic growing units, installed in Davies in 2022
- 5 Rain gardens across campus reduce runoff and provide a habitat for local wildlife
